- > Edge of field plantings

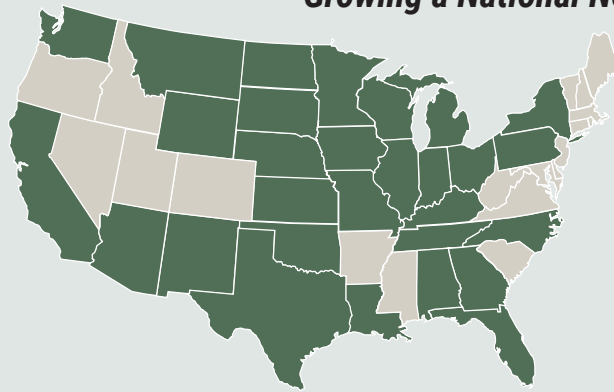

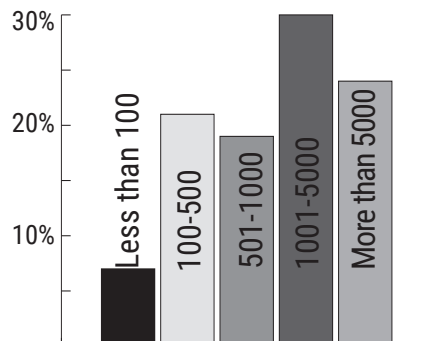

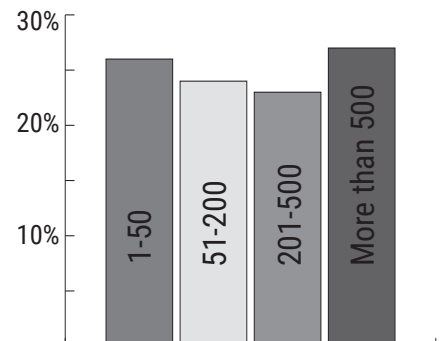
